

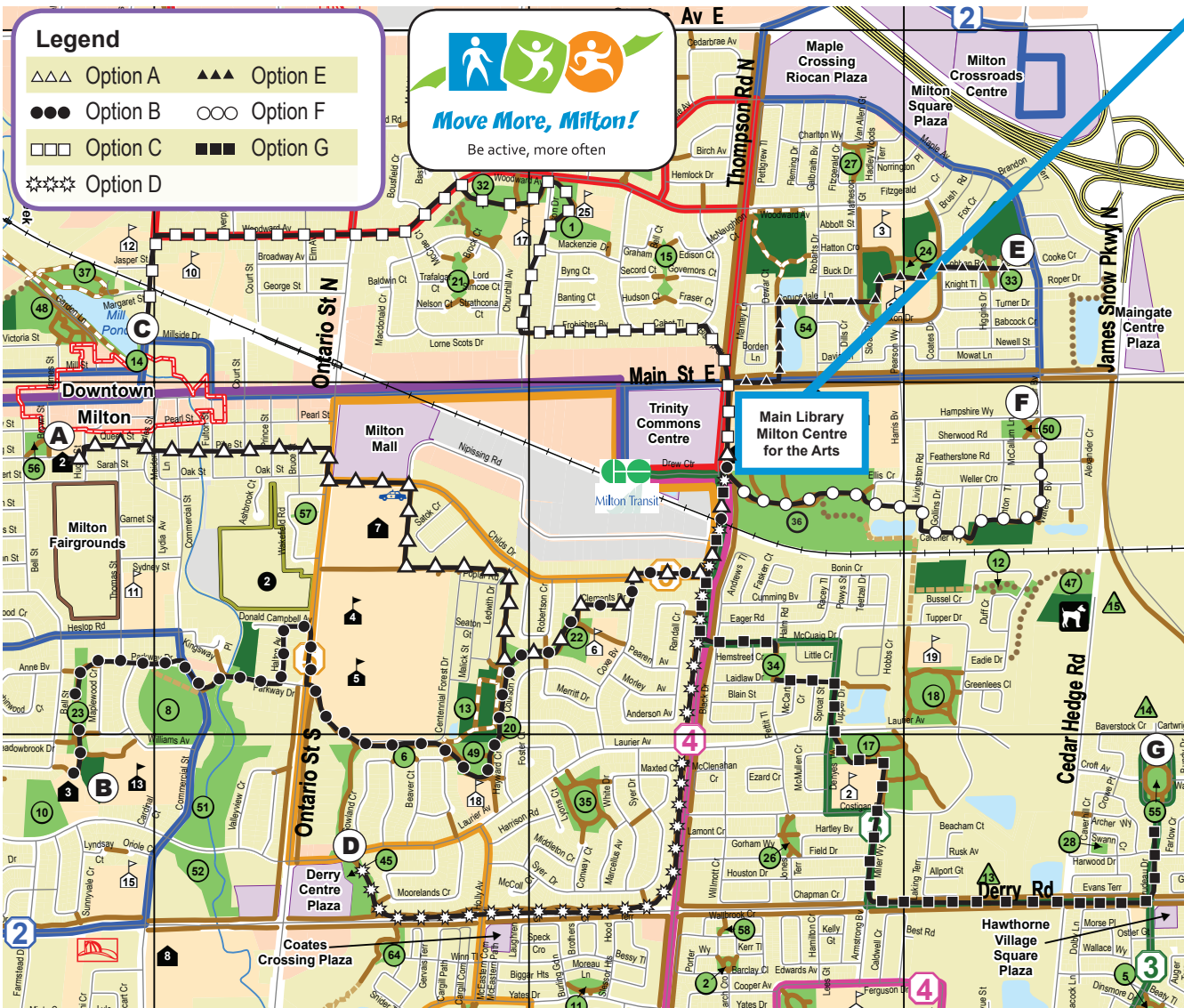
# Make your Way to “Main@Main”

To celebrate Recreation and Parks Month in June, consider leaving the car at home to visit the Main Library. Move More, Milton! is also celebrating Walking Month in June – it’s time to move more and read more, too!



Make each visit to the Main Library an outdoor adventure. Take a hike or ride your bike. Take to the trails or take transit. Take time to play at a park. Walk, stroll or saunter!

### Stroll or Spin

- Take different routes, trails and walkways, and explore parks along the way.
- Watch for bicycle racks — coming soon!
- Borrow a pedometer from the Library and track the number of steps you take each day to improve your health and well-being.

### Milton Transit – Connect with Transit

- Take Route 2 (every 30 minutes on weekdays) directly to the new Main Library.
- All transit routes connect at the GO Station, where you can transfer to Route 1 or 2 or walk to the Library via Drew Centre and Thompson Rd.
- All Milton Transit buses are fully accessible and are also equipped with bicycle rack carriers (2 bicycle limit).
- Ride free July 4 - September 2 with the annual Read and Ride Program (14 years and younger) by presenting a validated Library card.
- Seniors ride for free on Wednesdays in June for Seniors' Month.

## Option A

### Neighbourhoods: Old Milton and Timberlea

#### Points of interest:

- Victoria Park (gazebo, playground, cenotaph and historical features)
- Historic Hugh Foster Hall and Town Hall
- Milton Mall
- Milton Seniors' Activity Centre
- Timberlea Trail - one of the Town's longest connecting trail links in the central urban area
- Coxe Boulevard Park
- Milton Memorial Arena
- Lions Sports Park (spray pad, BMX facility, skate park, playground, accessible swings, sports fields, ball diamonds)

#### Fun-filled detour options along the way:

- Downtown restaurants, shops, boutiques and cafés
- Centennial Forest loop (woodchip trail; planted in 1967 by high school students)
- Trinity Commons Centre shops and restaurants: Main St. and Thompson Rd.

## Option B

### Neighbourhoods: Fallingbrook, Forest Grove and Timberlea

#### Points of interest:

- Bronte Meadows Park (basketball and tennis courts, playground, sports fields, ball diamond)
- John Tonelli Sports Centre
- David Thompson Woodlot/Park (playground)
- Brian Best Park (beach volleyball courts, sports fields, ball diamonds)
- Forest Grove Ravine (woodlot)
- Beaver Court Park
- Sam Sherratt Trail/Park (playground, ball diamonds)

#### Fun-filled detour options along the way:

- Moorelands Park, Centennial Forest and Coulson Park (playground)

## Option C

### Neighbourhoods: Old Milton, Mountain View and Dorset Park

#### Points of interest:

- Centennial Park
- Kinsmen Park (basketball and tennis courts, playground, accessible swings, sports fields, ball diamond)
- Baldwin Park (sports field, ball diamond)
- Milton Leisure Centre

#### Fun-filled detour options along the way:

- Melanie Park (playground, accessible swings) and Woodward Woodlot to stormwater management pond north of Main St.
- Mill Pond (includes woodchip trail), Rotary Park (pool, spray pads, tennis courts, playground, ball diamonds) and Livingston Forest/Park
- Convenience store at corner of Wilson Dr. and Woodward Ave.

## Option D

### Neighbourhoods: Timberlea and Coates

#### Points of interest:

- Moorelands Park
- Milton Memorial Arena
- Lions Sports Park (spray pad, BMX facility, skate park, playground, accessible swings, sports fields, ball diamond)

#### Fun-filled detour options along the way:

- Restaurants and shopping at Holly Ave. and Derry Rd.
- Restaurants and shopping at Derry Centre Plaza

## Option E

### Neighbourhood: Dempsey (north of CNR)

#### Points of interest:

- Knight Trail Park (playground)
- Dempsey Neighbourhood Park (basketball court, spray pads, playground, accessible swings, sports field)
- Dempsey Woodlot North/South
- Sprucedale Park (playground, accessible swings)
- Stormwater management pond
- Milton Leisure Centre

#### Fun-filled detour options along the way:

- Maple Woodlot (granular)
- Woodward Woodlot (woodchip)

### Special Features

- **Osage-orange Trees:** Explore the limestone path on the southern side of Dempsey Neighbourhood Park that leads to Sprucedale Park. You may notice some unusual green knobby fruit at the base of some peculiarly shaped trees. These are Osage-orange trees (Latin: *Maclura pomifera*), also commonly called Hedge-apple. The Osage-orange was brought to Canada from northern Texas and was used in early farm settlements.
- **Stormwater Management Ponds:** Watch these habitats for animal life, such as wood frogs, red-winged blackbirds, great blue herons and more!

## Option F

### Neighbourhood: Dempsey (south of CNR)

#### Points of interest:

- Waters Woodlot
- Milton Memorial Arena
- Lions Sports Park (spray pads, BMX facility, skate park, playground, accessible swings, sports fields, ball diamonds)

## Option G

### Neighbourhood: Clarke

#### Points of interest:

- Trudeau Park (playground)
- Clarke Neighbourhood Park South (spray pad, playground, accessible swings, sports field)
- Laidlaw Park (playground, accessible swings)
- Milton Memorial Arena
- Lions Sports Park (spray pad, BMX facility, skate park, playground, accessible swings, sports fields, ball diamonds)
